

Pupil Premium Expenditure 2014-15

Our Pupil Premium spreadsheet shows in detail how we have spent the money we were allocated last academic year for Pupil Premium. Here is an overview:

As you can see, we topped up the spending in some classes (particularly in Years 5 and 6) due to the very great need in these classes - there were some large progress gaps which needed to be closed as far as possible. The expenditure has fluctuated as children have left and other children have been identified as Pupil Premium. The figure for 2014-15 was £83,200, which includes pupils who have left the school as the figures are based on the previous year's census. The current figure for 2015-16 is £75,480 which matches our own records of pupils who were in the school last year, and tallies closely with our own figures (above). We are continuing to allocate Pupil Premium funding on a child by child basis, using our Pupil Progress meetings to check the provision is appropriate for each child, and is having an impact.
