## School Closures and Emergencies

This seems a good moment to remind everyone what our procedures are for closing the school or getting information out to parents in the event of unforeseen emergencies, such as a major incident in the vicinity of the school.

We've had lots of enquiries about whether we are open in this snowy weather. Nobody in school can remember ever closing for snow - but that is not to say we never would! The decision to close the school, or a class, would be taken between 8.30 and 8.45 when we are more likely to know which members of staff have made it to school. We cannot make the decision earlier than that unless it was something straightforward such as the central heating boiler breaking down or a serious flood.

As soon as we have the information we need we would:

• Text all parents to explain that school is closed

- Email all parents with the same information
- Put a notice on the Home Page of the school website

The first thing we would do is text you - the other actions would follow that, depending on time.

We ask all parents to wait until 8.30/8.40 if they think school may be closed.

Unless we specifically send you a text message, email etc then always assume that the school is open as usual.

If there was an emergency in the local area, then we would use the same

In the case of local emergencies in particular we also ask parents **NOT** to 'phone the school. We only have one landline in and out of school and if we would need this for essential communications, with the emergency services, for example.
