#### SATs results

We are also finishing on a high with our SATs results this year:

At the end of **Foundation Stage**, 47% of children achieved a 'Good Level of Development' - almost twice as many as last year.

In KS1: 93% achieved the expected level (L2) in Reading, 85% in Writing and 100% in Maths. 44% achieved Level 3 in Reading, 15% in Writing and 26% in Maths.

In KS2: 100% achieved the expected level (L4) in Reading, 81% in Writing, 89% in Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (EGPS), and 96% in Maths. 41% achieved at least Level 5 in Reading, 19% in Writing, 63% in EGPS and 30% in Maths (7% Level 6!).

All of these results are an improvement on our previous performance, and we can be extremely proud of our clever children (and excellent staff) for achieving them.



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## **Summer Holiday Ideas**

Now that you have the next 6 weeks in front of you, here are some ideas and tips to help you make the most of the holiday time:

#### Holiday diaries:

It is always a great idea for children to keep a diary of their summer break, or make a scrapbook with postcards, photos, tickets etc from the activities they do.

#### **Universal Free School Meals**

All children in F2, Year I and Year 2 can have a school dinner for free from September.

However, if you think you are eligible for "free school meals" (usually because you receive benefits eg income support) please let us know because then we can claim extra money for the school. This is called the 'Pupil Premium'.
